

**FIRST READING:** Hosea 11:1-11

<sup>1</sup> When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. <sup>2</sup> The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. <sup>3</sup> Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. <sup>4</sup> I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them. <sup>5</sup> They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. <sup>6</sup> The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. <sup>7</sup> My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all. <sup>8</sup> How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. <sup>9</sup> I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath. <sup>10</sup> They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. <sup>11</sup> They shall

come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria; and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.  
For the word of the Lord: **Thanks be to God.**

### **PSALM 107:1-9,43**

- <sup>1</sup> O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good:  
**for his loving mercy is for ever.**
- <sup>2</sup> Let the Lord's redeemed say so:  
**whom he has redeemed from the hand of the enemy,**
- <sup>3</sup> And gathered in from every land,  
from the east and from the west:  
**from the north and from the south.**
- <sup>4</sup> Some went astray in the wilderness and in the desert:  
**and found no path to an inhabited city;**
- <sup>5</sup> They were hungry and thirsty:  
**and their heart fainted within them.**
- <sup>6</sup> Then they cried to the Lord in their distress:  
**and he took them out of their trouble.**
- <sup>7</sup> He led them by the right path:  
**till they came to an inhabited city.**
- <sup>8</sup> Let them thank the Lord for his goodness:  
**and for the wonders that he does  
for the children of Adam;**
- <sup>9</sup> For he satisfies the thirsty:  
**and fills the hungry with good things.**
- <sup>43</sup> Whoever is wise, let them observe these things:  
**and consider the loving-kindness of the Lord.**

### **SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-11**

<sup>1</sup> So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, <sup>3</sup> for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. <sup>5</sup> Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). <sup>6</sup> On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. <sup>7</sup> These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. <sup>8</sup> But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. <sup>9</sup> Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices <sup>10</sup> and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the

image of its creator. <sup>11</sup> In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

For the Word of the Lord: **Thanks be to God.**

**THE GOSPEL:** Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, chapter 12, beginning at the 13th verse.

*Response* **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

<sup>13</sup> Someone in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' <sup>14</sup> But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' <sup>15</sup> And he said to them, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' <sup>16</sup> Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. <sup>17</sup> And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?"' <sup>18</sup> Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. <sup>19</sup> And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." <sup>20</sup> But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?"' <sup>21</sup> So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.' The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.**
